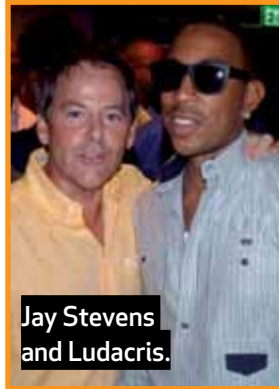


# Radio One Programmers Take Over Atlanta

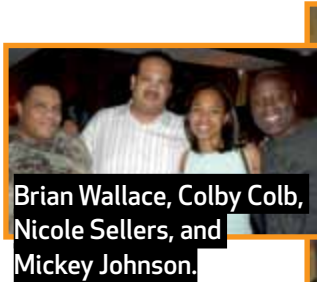
